April 8th, Monti. Inc fabricated and donated identification numbers for the front line fire apparatus



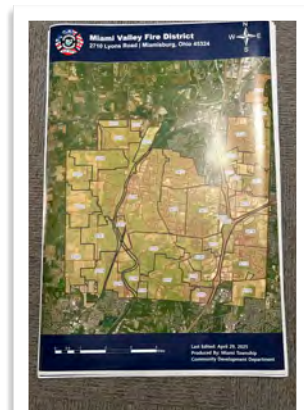
April 9th, Mission BBQ donated \$1678.00 to the Miami Valley Fire District

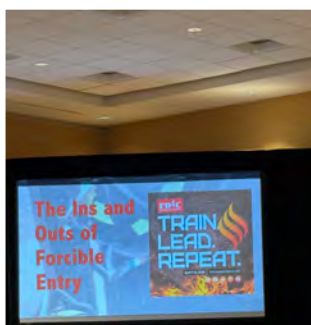
Crews spent the month working on Forcible Entry Techniques on the prop on loan from Lewisburg FD

April 15 and 16th, Company 54 visited St. James Preschool and spoke with students about fire safety



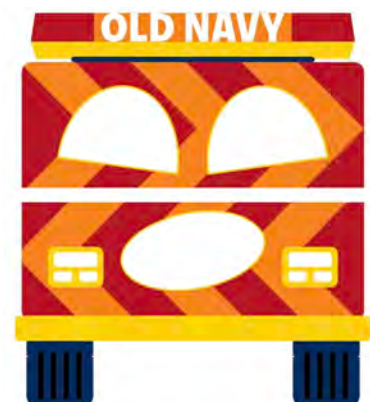
April 17th, a Dedication Ceremony was held at Station 51 for placing in service the new Spartan Fire Engine

April 14th, Multiple Crews responded mutual aid to Washington Twp. on a Structure Fire

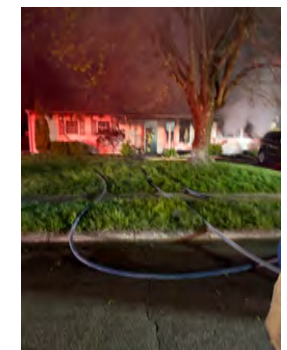
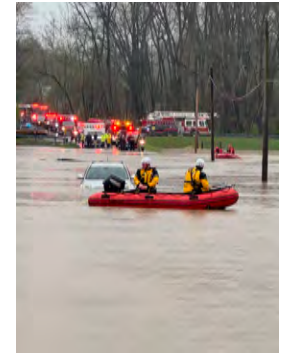
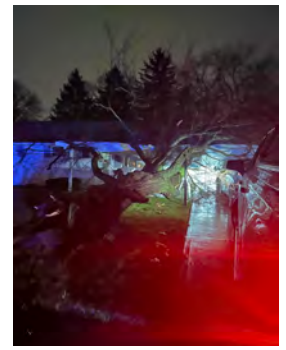
April 16th, E52 and BC50 responded mutual aid to Franklin on a Structure Fire

April 30th, Crews responded to a Structure Fire on Valette Cir. North. No injuries were reported and cause of the fire is under investigation



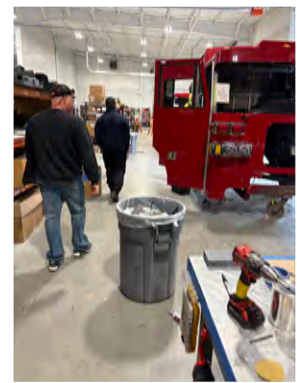
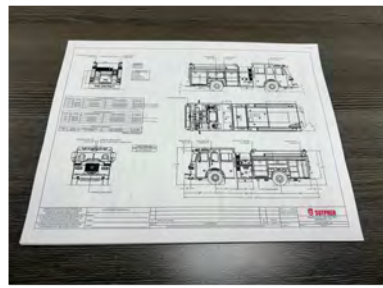
Capital Improvement and Equipment
