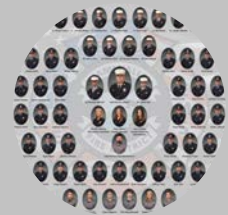
Preparing for the Future

February 12th, Brad Herr was sworn in as Fire Marshal of the Miami Valley Fire District



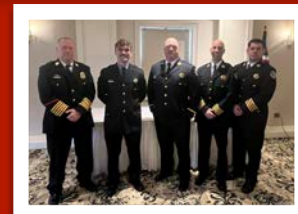
Members of A Shift were recognized at the Board of Trustees Meeting for their Meritorious Conduct while operating at a Structure Fire on Buckeye St.



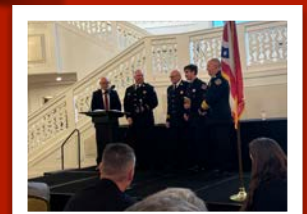
February 16th, Kyle Steward started his position as Fire Prevention Specialist for the Miami Valley Fire District

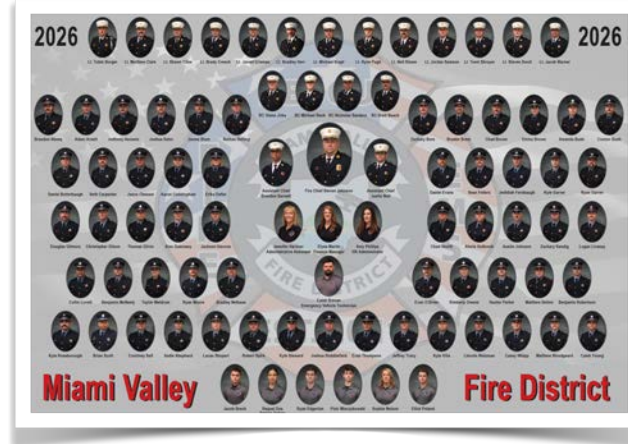
They were also recognized as Firefighters of the Year by the Montgomery County Fire Chief's Association

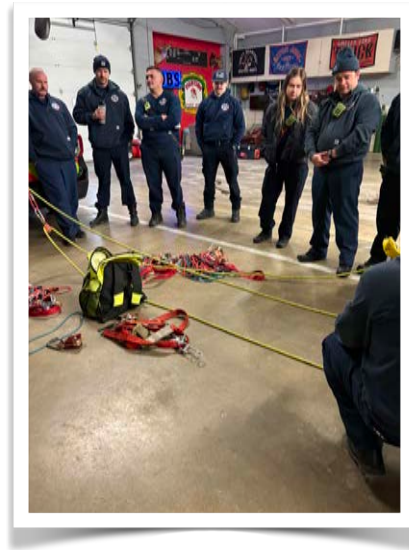

February 3rd, Crews responded to an MVC with Entrapment on I75 Northbound. One removal was made from the scene

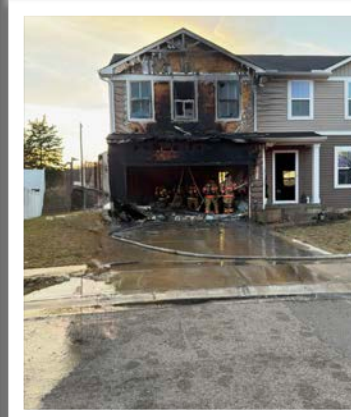


February 3rd, E52 responded to a Vehicle Fire on Springboro Pk.



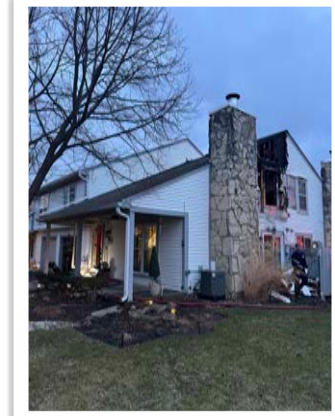
February 3rd, Crews responded to an MVC with Extrication Springboro Pk near Mall Woods. One transport was made from the scene

February 28th, Multiple crews responded mutual aid to Washington Twp. on a Structure Fire

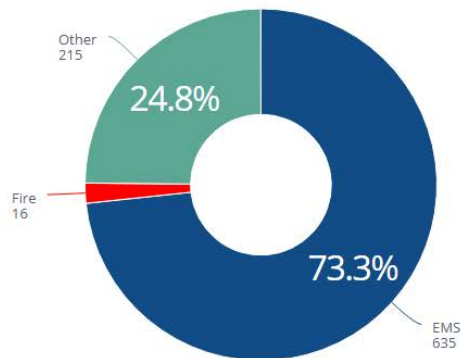

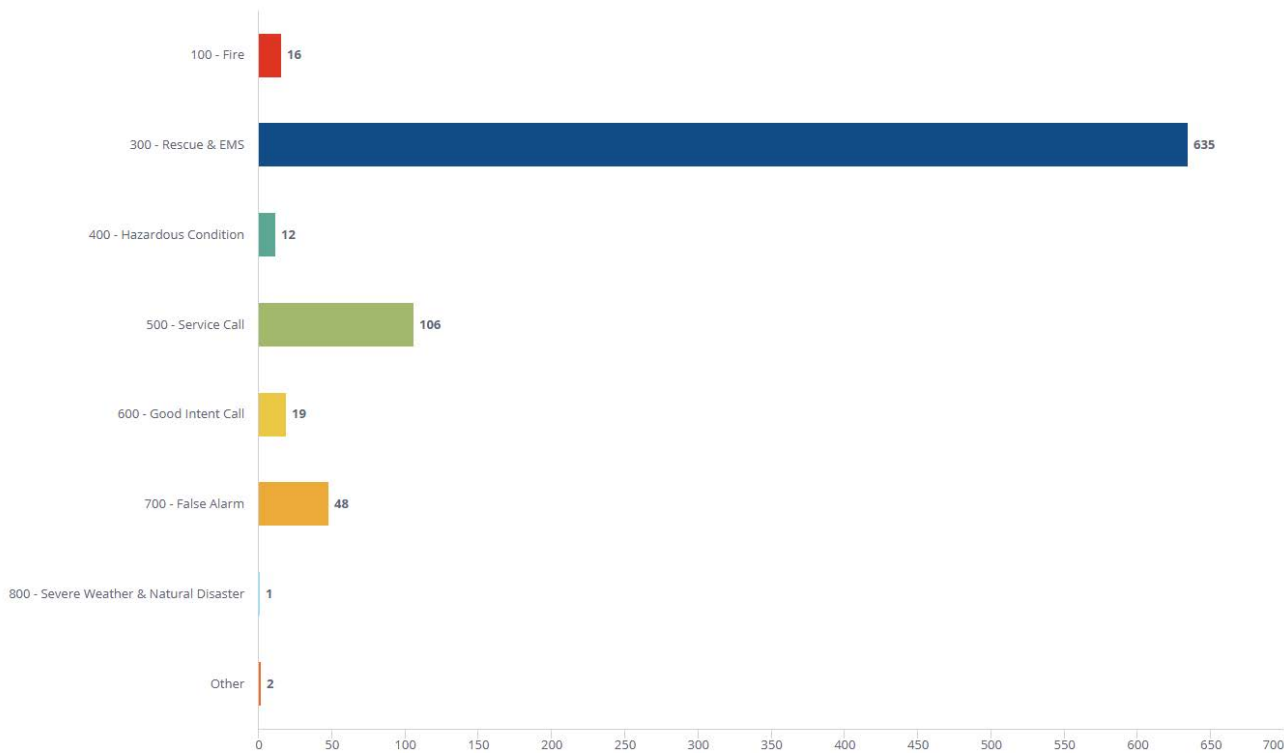

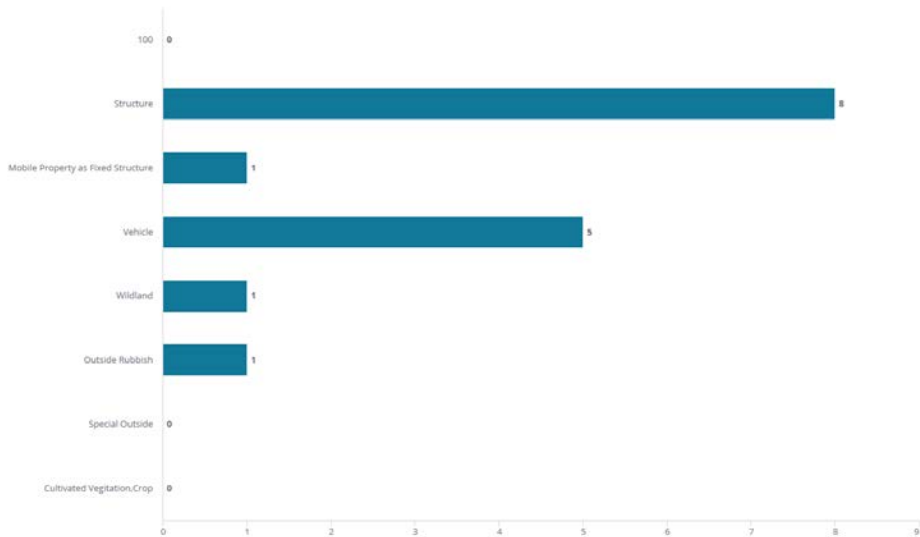
EMS/Fire Incident Breakdown

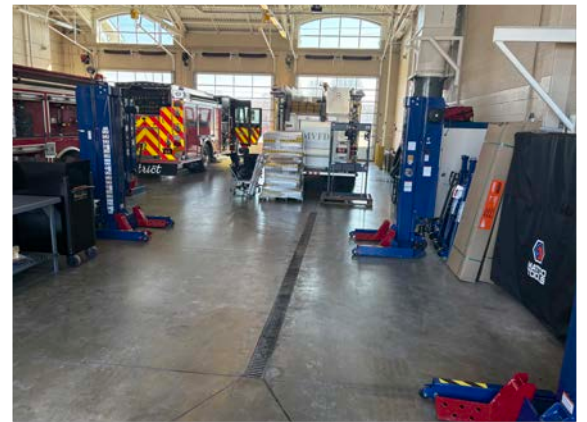
Several Members were in Minnesota at Rosenbauer to finalize the Pre-Build of a new ladder truck

EVT Brewer has finished training and set up of Apparatus Lifts and they are available for use



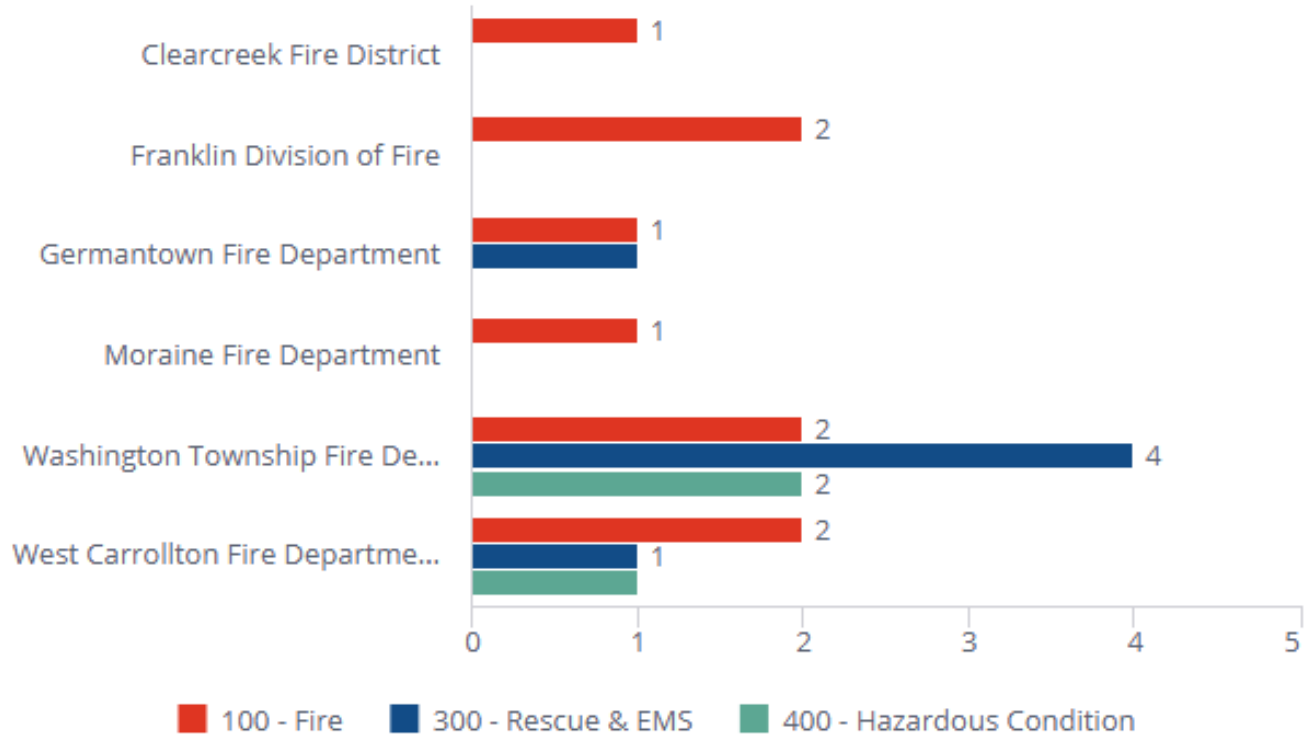
Tool cache continues to arrive for EVT Brewer and placed in service



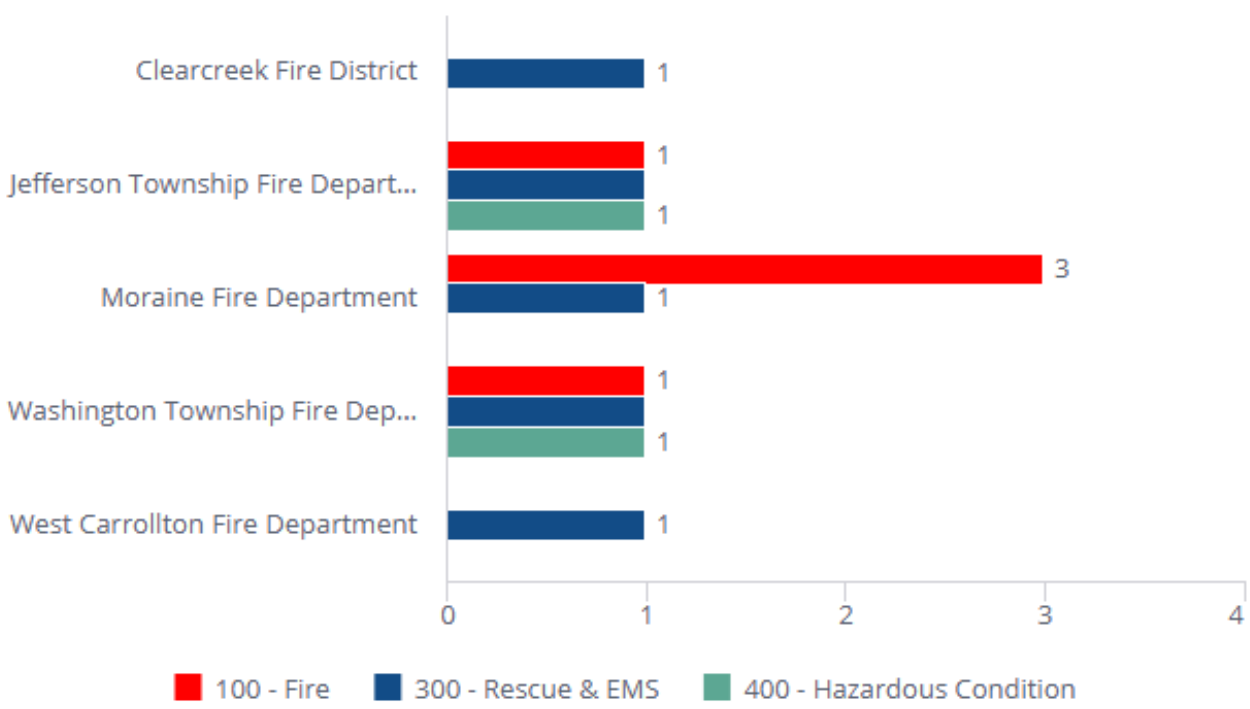
